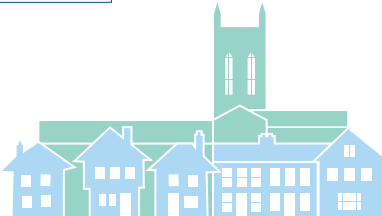

The history of our town stretches back over a thousand years, starting with the martyrdom of Edmund, Anglo Saxon king of East Anglia. Later came the establishment of the Benedictine Abbey dedicated to St Edmund, the former king, which became a major focus of pilgrimage in the Middle Ages. The town grew into a vibrant commercial centre driven by the prosperous agricultural industry of the area and attracted many visitors and the local gentry to the social life in its Subscription Rooms, Regency theatre, Inns and fairs. The buildings reflect this long history with their Norman and Georgian architecture, right up to the 21st century with the Apex - a concert and music venue.
